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STORER News from the Reservation

We have had a busy year so far up on the hill, and it looks like things are heating up as we head toward winter. To kick off our summer, we hosted all kinds of Scouting America leadership training, starting with Wood Badge, a two-week program for adults, followed by a week-long National Youth Leadership Training. July kicked off six weeks of Summer Day Camp, which was enjoyed by kids from Barnstead, Alton, Strafford, Barrington, and Pittsfield.

Our Summer Archery partnership with Barnstead Parks & Recreation is entering the final session of 2024. Over 40 local kids have come and learned from our USA Level 1 Coaches: Sophie, Ivan, and Victoria. Look for this to start up again in the spring.

With the start of the school year, we have launched our SOAR after-school camp. Kids hop on the Green Bus with Buffy for the ride to camp, where they are greeted by our counselors to begin a three-hour outdoor academic program. Each day starts with a hike to snack time, followed by some movement to get the bodies moving. Snack is followed by an outdoor adventure, leading to our academic time to work on homework, quiet reading, or receive help in specific areas. Once that is done, we are back on an adventure to finish the day. Of course, my favorite day is Friday because that is when Coach Sophie is here for archery.

To kick off the school year for Barnstead Elementary's sixth graders, we hosted a four-day, three-night Outdoor Wilderness Adventure. The first order of business for the kids was to set up their tents, and then the adventures began. We hiked during the day and at night to stargaze from different camp areas. We found animal tracks, kayaked, went fishing, set traps to catch small critters, met some turtles and a porcupine, had a campfire, sang songs, and performed skits. We also learned that one inch of water in Adams Pond is about 756,000 gallons, which weighs 6,297,480 lbs. Now imagine how many gallons are in the whole pond, which is 40 feet deep!

While discussing the weight of water, we took a look at the spillway and showed the kids how we lower and raise the water levels in the two ponds. With the summer being so dry, they got to see the immediate effect on the connecting creek when we let water flow.

Our SOAR program will run concurrently with the BES calendar throughout the school year, taking breaks during the winter and spring vacation weeks. During those weeks, we offer a Monday-Friday camp for grades K-6 to enjoy outdoor adventures like fishing, hiking, archery, wildlife tracking, and more. JEANNIE'S RECIPE CORNER



CABBAGE AND KIELBASA





- 1 Onion chopped
- 2 Lg. Sweet Potato
- 1 Cabbage Shredded
- 1/2 Tsp. Celery Seed
- 4 Cups Chicken Broth
- I2 Kielbasa cut into 1 inch pieces
- 1 Apple (quartered with skin on)
- · Salt and Pepper to taste



Directions:

- 1. Use a large soup pan or Dutch Oven pan and add the broth, sweet potatoes cut into 1" pieces, and chopped onion and cook until tender.
- 2. Add the shredded cabbage and celery seed. As it starts to cook down add the Kielbasa, salt and pepper and cook until cabbage is cooked through.
- 3. Add quartered apple (without seeds). Turn heat off, cover pan and let sit for 5 to 10 minutes.
- 4. Serve with your favorite hard bread.

Makes 6 servings.

Jacques Cartier first brought cabbage to the Americas in 1541-42. It was likely planted by the early English colonist, despite the lack of written evidence of its existence there until the mid-17th century. By the 18th century, it was commonly planted by both colonist and Native Americans. And here we are still enjoying it.
