
The Last Stories by Malcolm Locke - **\$10**

So rapidly that 90% of the brain is developed before a child even enters Kindergarten. Children love to learn from the caring adults in their lives.



RECIPE CORNER

Holiday Cranberry Bread

In 1977, Barnstead celebrated its 250th anniversary.
As part of the celebration, the Historical Society produced a recipe book, using 250 recipe's submitted by many local families. With the holiday season upon us, the recipe seemed appropriate.

2 cups flour 3/4 c. orange Juice
1 cup sugar 2 tbsp. butter
1 T. grated orange peel | l egg
| 1/2 tsp. baking powder | c. chopped cranberries
1/2 tsp. baking soda 1/2-1 c. chopped nuts

Combine all ingredients except cranberries and nuts in a large bowl. Mix well. Stir in cranberries and nuts. Pour into prepared pan, a greased and lightly floured fluted tube pan. Bake in 325° (350° otherwise) oven for 35-45 minutes or until cake tester inserted in center comes out clean. Immediately remove from pan. Serve warm or cold.
