#### **Local Haunted Tours**



Feeling bo(o)red in this month of spooks and frights? Then you're in luck, cause here's a list of conveniently located haunted places for your viewing pleasure. Hopefully this directory will fill you with ghoulish delight and get you in the Halloween spirit

**Alton Town Hall** - 1 Monument Square Reports have been made of loud footsteps. furniture moving by itself, doors opening and closing on their own, and strange voices when nobody else is about. I think Barnstead needs to get moving on having our own ghost at the town hall - and no, that is not a suggestion to 'make' one. Maybe just make one up.

Mary's Bridge - Pittsfield This bridge was named after poor Mary Bodge, a young woman who drowned in the Suncook river at this site in 1874. To let ice pass through, a Mr. Butman and a Captain Towle took down the small footbridge people used to cross the river. Unfortunately, they didn't warn anyone, or erect a barrier. Mary was returning home from work that night, still thinking the footbridge was in place, and fell headlong into the river. Attempts were made to save her, but she didn't make it. Strangely enough, I've found no reports of the bridge being haunted. Though maybe no one has lingered long enough to learn the truth. So if you visit, pause a bit (on the bridge, not in the water), then report back to me if you have any sightings.

Bow Lake - Strafford and Northwood Over the years, people have heard calls for help at the lake when no one is there; others have seen strange lights. One interesting phenomenon centers on the sky, which allegedly appears at times to be as bright as daylight from midnight to 3:15. My theory is that the fish are having a party and the strange lights are their disco lights.



#### **New Hampshire State Hospital** - 105

Pleasant St. Concord Originally called the New Hampshire Asylum for the Insane (just makes you want to be a patient there, doesn't it?), the NH State Hospital was built in 1842. People report hearing mysterious footsteps, elevators starting without intervention, objects getting pushed off tables, unexplained cold spots, and feeling someone is there even when no one is. I'm pretty sure this unsettled environment is not what a doctor would order for someone with mental health problems.

#### Margaritas Mexican Restaurant - 1

Bicentennial Sq. Concord Once a county jail, Margaritas is now home to a Mexican restaurant. The renovators preserved a few of the jail cells for private seating and I can't imagine wanting to eat anywhere else. A resident ghost named George (Jorge?), who may or may not have been a resident of the Concord clink (and judging by what comes next, I'm going to hazard a guess that he was), allegedly likes to throw food, move tables and chairs, rearrange table settings, finish off beverages (hands off my beer, George!), and annoy staff and customers. Sounds like George is finishing off more adult beverages than is good for a ghost. But perhaps he just likes to get into the spirit of things. Continued on next Page

Laconia State School - Laconia Once known by the name New Hampshire School for the Feebleminded (was that word really the best they could come up with?) Children, the building opened for business in 1903. Due to the horrific treatment of the inhabitants, including the use of forced sterilization and rampant overcrowding, it finally closed in 1991. The building was then turned into a prison, now closed, as well. (I'm sensing a trend here.) A former prison employee reported hearing sounds of children laughing and feeling like he wasn't alone when he most definitely was. He also said that one time the face of a woman seemed to project from the wall as he approached it. Though maybe he was simply experiencing an early version of FaceTime.

The Tilton Inn (The 1875 Inn) - 255 Main St. Tilton The show Ghost Hunters once filmed an episode at the Tilton Inn, which is said to be haunted by a ghost named Laura. Back in the 1800s, Laura allegedly died in a fire at the inn when she was only 12. Guests today have reported that they've spotted and 'felt' the presence of a young girl throughout the inn. Interestingly enough, Thomas Edison once stayed at the inn. I wonder if he ever met Laura. If he had, I imagine it would have been a particularly electrifying experience.

Three Chimneys Inn - 17 Newmarket Rd. Durham In 1649 a man named Valentine Hill built the oldest part of the inn, though it's his daughter, Hannah, who is said to haunt the place. It's believed she drowned in the Oyster River, which runs close to the inn. Apparently, ghost Hannah really likes electronics, especially cell phones. Staff members have also heard 'someone' practicing a cello for hours in one of the rooms, even though no one is there (the staff member who first heard it thought it was a guest – it was not). My theory is that it's Hannah playing iTunes on a cell(o)phone she 'borrowed' from an unsuspecting customer.

Cocheco Falls Millworks - 100 Main St. Dover In 1907, a fire broke out, damaging the structure and killing several mill workers (some of whom were children). The building was eventually renovated and is now home to tenants and businesses. The strange phenomenon most often reported are unexplained lights appearing at night, mainly on the upper floors where, coincidentally, the workers who died were trapped. Down in the basement, lights inexplicably turn on and off.

Disembodied voices have been heard, most prominently in the entry to the two towers and in the stairwells. Some say they have heard noises from the machines used in the mill-machines that no longer exist. Shadowy figures and disembodied laughter have both been reported, as well. You'd think people wouldn't want to live there with all the ghosts, but I have to admit that any conversation with the departed is likely to be quite spirited. ng off more adult beverages than is good for a ghost. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, also known as SNAP, provides food assistance through an electronic card that can be used at grocery stores and some farmers' markets. SNAP is available to everyone who is eligible, regardless of household size. There are sufficient benefits for all eligible individuals, and receiving SNAP doesn't take benefits away from others.

Individuals may work and still have income low enough to be eligible for SNAP benefits. The benefits you receive are determined on an individual basis. The only way to find out how much SNAP you could receive is to apply. Learn more and apply at dhhs.nh.gov/snap.

Do you have questions or need assistance with the application process? The NH Food Bank offers SNAP application assistance services to Granite Staters with limited income. SNAP is a federal program of the USDA and is administered by the New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services.

#### APPLESAUCE SPICE BARS

#### Ingredients:

• 1 cup all-purpose flour

3/4 cup packed brown sugar

- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 1 cup applesauce
- 1/4 cup shortening
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup raisins

**Browned Butter Frosting (below)** 



#### Directions

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees. Mix all ingredients except frosting. Spread in a greased 9x13x2 inch baking pan.
- 2. Bake for about 25 minutes, cool. Frost with Browned Butter Frosting
- 3. Cut into 3"x1" bars. About 3 dozen.

#### **BROWNED BUTTER FROSTING**

- 1. Heat 3 tablespoons butter over medium heat until delicate brown, remove from heat.
- 2. Beat in 1 1/2 cup powdered sugar, 1 tsp vanilla, and about 1 Tbsp milkuntil smooth and of spreading consistency.
