Elections

Source: "History of Barnstead, New Hampshire", by Jeremiah P. Jewett, M.D.

March 29, 1774. At a Meeting of the town, at the home of Benjamin Nutter (the town hall was not constructed until much later), it was voted that "Pittsfield Road" be laid out from near Suncook bridge on the Province Road, on the south side of the road near the river, as trees are now spotted through the land". John Tasker, Thomas Edgerly and Benjamin Nutter were elected as Selectmen.

November 22, 1775. Voters were called together for the first time to choose both State and county officers. This was called in connection with voters from Gilmanton at the home of William Parsons, junior. Joseph Badger was unanimously elected to the office of assembly man (representative) to attend a meeting of the legislature in December of that year in Exeter. A resolution was also passed recommending continuation of the war.

RECIPE CORNER

CRAB DIP

Ingredients:

- 3 packages softened cream cheese
- 3 cans of drained crab meat (2 white crab and one lump crab)
- 1 onion diced and sauteed until soft

- · Italian seasoning to taste
- · A dash of garlic powder
- 1 to 2 serving spoons of mayonnaise
- 1 pound of shredded cheese (a variety mixed together)



Directions

- 2. Spray a 9x13 dish and add mixture
- 3. Sprinkle parmesan cheese on top and bake at 375 degrees for 20-25 minutes until it is brown on top.
