

#### Beyond Eggs: What It Really Takes to Keep a Farm in Business

Walk into a New England farmers market in July and you'll find tables overflowing with fresh produce. By October, those same tables look sparse, and some visitors leave disappointed. But that's not failure on the farmer's part — it's simply the reality of farming here.

Our growing season in New England is short. Frost comes early, soil cools quickly, and without expensive greenhouses and heating systems, fresh produce becomes impossible this late in the year. At the same time, farmland is shrinking. Between 2001 and 2016, New England lost more than 100,000 acres of agricultural land to development. Projections suggest that by 2040, New England could lose another 267,000 acres of farmland if current trends continue. Every hayfield turned into a subdivision is land that will never graze livestock or grow vegetables again.


Small farmers also face high costs. We pay nearly the same price for grain as consumers do at the feed store, and no one offers us discounts at the butcher. Add in zoning and planning restrictions, certified scale inspections, insurance hikes, and health department requirements, and the challenges stack even higher. Yet farms continue. They continue because we believe good food and open land are worth fighting for. But the truth is, we cannot do it alone. Farming in New England will only survive if communities choose to support it. That means buying local, embracing seasonality, and valuing not just fresh produce, but also meats, baked goods, and even the crafts that help farmers cover costs. It means showing up at town meetings and making sure ordinances support — not hinder — agriculture.

The future of farming here isn't guaranteed. It's a choice. And it belongs to all of us.

#### **Bandstands of Barnstead**

Barnstead is home to multiple bandstands and a gazebo: the Barnstead Parade Bandstand, the Center Barnstead Bandstand, and, as of 2024, a gazebo located behind the Oscar Foss Memorial Library.

Barnstead's oldest bandstand, constructed around 1924, stands about a mile from the town center. Now a century old, this octagonal wooden structure sits on the village green known as the Barnstead Parade. It continues to serve as a community hub, hosting summer concerts, farmers' markets, and other town gatherings. The Parade Bandstand features a low wooden base, paneled sides, sturdy posts, and an octagonal roof. Nearby are the Parade Church, the Post Office, and Fire Station 1.

The later bandstand, built around 1937, is located in Center Barnstead near the Town Hall and Fire Station 2. More elaborate than its predecessor, this octagonal structure rests on a tall concrete base with paneled walls and wooden columns supporting the roof. The base once housed a concession stand that sold hot dogs, popcorn, popcorn balls, and ice cream to concertgoers during community events.

Both bandstands are closely tied to a local band that became active in the 1920s under the leadership of John J. Jenkins, a Barnstead native and rural mail carrier. The Barnstead Historical Society sponsored the repair and refurbishment of the Center Bandstand in 1998, and the Parade Bandstand was renovated in 2022.

As of 2024, the library's gazebo joins this tradition of community gathering spaces. Its missing peak cap is noted—and its return would be much appreciated.

## Jeannie's Recipe Corner

#### Getting Ready for the Holidays!

- 1. Start early and make a menu for the special day.

- 9. Plan an evening of fun.
- 10. Take a walk, play a game, or simply enjoy your family and guests.
- 11. Don't forget the turkey!
- 12. If you're serving one, give it plenty of time to thaw safely in the refrigerator, and store leftovers properly after your meal.

#### Jeannie's Crab Dip

#### Ingredients

- 3 packages (8 oz each) softened cream cheese
- 3 cans drained crabmeat
- 1 onion, diced and sautéed
- Italian seasoning, to taste
- 1–2 serving spoons mayonnaise
- 1 pound shredded cheese (a mix of your favorites)
- Grated Parmesan for topping

#### Instructions

Mix everything together and spread into a baking dish. Top with grated Parmesan.

Bake at 400°F for about 20 minutes, until bubbly and golden.
