Good to Know Info: We are closed for staff training on the second Thursday of every month until 3:00 (Dec. 11). For the holidays, we are closed Wednesday, Dec. 24, and Thursday, Dec. 25, for Christmas, and Wednesday, Dec. 31, and Thursday, Jan. 1, 2026, for New Year's!

Oscar's Elves are back in the house! Some of us are terrible at wrapping (and rapping), and could use some assistance. Those gifted with wrapping talent are here to help with all of your holiday wrapping needs. We will have wrapping paper, tags, bags, and ribbon. Bring in your gifts to have them wrapped while you check out what the library has to offer. The wrapping is free, but you're more than welcome to give a donation to the library to be used to fund future programming (and maybe for training for the wrapping-impaired). Home School Group: Join us Fridays from 11:00-1:00 for a mix of stories, simple science/learning activities, and a creative art/craft activity that all go along with a theme for the week. The activities are geared towards kids ages 4 and up, and younger siblings are welcome to come along. There will be an event posted ahead of time on their Facebook group (Barnstead NH Library Homeschool Group) for each weekly meet-up, so you'll always know what to expect and if you need to bring anything.

Music and Movement Storytime, aka Littles Love to Learn! Join us on Tuesdays at 10:30 for an interactive storytime filled with stories, songs, and loads of sensory play designed specifically for toddlers.

Every Wednesday at 10:30 is Children's Storytime. Visit us at the library for stories, crafts, and singing. Then experience the cozy ambience in the children's area, which has all sorts of neat things to do. Make new friends. Set up playdates. Check out books, movies, and games, play with the trains, Legos, and puppets. Come for the learning, stay for the fun!

Start your week off with Yoga Monday! Gentle Hatha-Flow runs from 10:15-11:40, Senior/Beginner/Chair Yoga is 12:00-1:00, and Intermediate Hatha-Flow lasts from 5:30-6:50. Classes are by donation (suggested \$8). All are welcome and encouraged to attend, regardless of ability to donate.

Jamming Tuesdays at OFML: 6:00-8:00 (ages 18+). Do you play a string instrument? Well then, dust it off and come make music with us! On the first (Dec. 2) and third (Dec. 16) Tuesdays of the month, join us for jam nights at the library (in the meeting room). No need to be an expert—just bring your instrument and a love of music. Share a few tunes, trade chords, get feedback (if you'd like), and most of all, have fun!

Our Read the Room (new name, same club) Book Club (ages 18+) takes place on the first Wednesday of the month (Dec. 3), from 6:00-7:30, in the library. This month's book will be "Because We Are Bad" by Lily Bailey. Next month's book will be "Thursday Murder Club" by Richard Osman. Books are available at the library. Bring food, bring thoughts, bring a friend!

Let's Write a Novel! Join us in the library's meeting room for a series of structured classes on the how-to's of writing a book. This class typically runs from 6:00-7:30 on the last Friday of the month, but is being changed to Friday (Dec. 12) due to the upcoming holidays. Budding writers, 16 and older, ignite your passion for storytelling, discover how to build your hero's journey, and take your novel from concept to can-do!

On Saturday, Dec. 13, Barnstead is holding a Community Christmas Event! All you fans of Hallmark's Holiday movies, you'll want to check this out. There will be a cookie walk at the Barnstead Parade Congregational church starting at 9AM, a hot cocoa bar and reading of "The Night Before Christmas" at the library at 1PM, followed by a presentation by Sam McKeen on the Origins of Christmas at 2PM, and a tree lighting and toy drive event with the Barnstead Fire Department and Parks & Rec! 

CATAMOUNT WOMENAID UPDATE

When a single dad needs his car repaired so he can get to work, or a family suddenly needs a rent security deposit for an unexpected move, Catamount Womenaid steps in, quickly and quietly.


Catamount Womenaid is a women-led, all-volunteer nonprofit that provides fast, confidential, one-time financial assistance to individuals and families facing urgent needs in Barnstead, Deerfield, Epsom, Northwood, Pittsfield, and Strafford. Requests come from trusted community validators, such as school nurses, social workers, case managers, clergy, and medical providers, ensuring help reaches those who need it most, without red tape. Payments go directly to vendors such as landlords, utility companies, or auto shops, creating immediate and lasting impact.

Thanks to generous sponsors, grants, and new revenue from Casino Charitable Gaming, we've doubled our in-area assistance limit to \$2,000 and continue to offer up to \$500 for out-of-area requests in partnership with other Womenaid groups statewide. We also provided seed funding to help launch Womenaid of the Hamptons and meet regularly with other NH Womenaid organizations to share best practices.

From January 1 through October 15, 2025, CWA distributed \$56,000 in assistance across 28 New Hampshire communities, including our six local towns, and we are on track to reach \$75,000 by year's end. Needs continue to grow as public support programs shift. Assistance has helped families with emergency car repairs, housing deposits, medical bills, safe storage during transitions, and transportation for medical treatment.

Through our School Essentials Fund, we also support students in our six towns, \$500 per school, replenished as needed, for immediate needs like winter clothing, eyeglasses, snacks, hygiene products, and school supplies. With no paid staff and minimal overhead, nearly every donated dollar goes directly to helping neighbors in crisis. Our board includes strong fiscal leadership, including two accountants and a former NH State Treasurer. Jeannie's Recipe Corner

December is a wonderfully busy month — shopping, wrapping gifts, baking treats, and cooking big meals to share with family and friends. It can also be stressful, so make things as easy on yourself as possible so you can truly enjoy the season.

One great trick is to bake ahead. Cookies freeze beautifully, and so do pies. Bake your pies early in the month and freeze them. When you're ready to serve one, take it out of the freezer and let it sit on the counter for about 10 minutes. Then place it in a 250-300° oven and reheat for 30-35 minutes. You'll have a warm, fresh-tasting pie ready for your family and guests.

Sweet breads and muffins can also be doubled and frozen for later.

You can save yourself even more time by cooking extra meals you can pull out on a busy evening — soups, stews, mac and cheese, American chop suey, meatballs, casseroles. Make a little extra now so you have something quick and comforting ready to go when you need it.

Chicken and Ham Casserole **Ingredients**

- 2½ lbs cooked boneless chicken breast or tenders
- 1-2 lbs cooked sliced ham
- 2 packages mixed vegetables (carrots, broccoli, cauliflower), lightly steamed

Assembly

- 1. Layer the chicken, then the ham in a 9" x 12" baking dish.
- 2. Add the mixed vegetables on top.
- 3. Pour cheese sauce (recipe below) over the meat and veggies.
- 4. Bake at 350° for 30 minutes, or until bubbly.
- 5. Serve with warm rolls for a complete meal.

Cheese Sauce

- ½ stick butter
- 2½ Tbsp flour
- 2 cups milk
- 2 cups cheddar cheese (or your favorite a sharper cheese works well!)

Melt the butter in a saucepan and whisk in the flour. Slowly add the milk, stirring until smooth. Add cheese and heat until fully melted and creamy.

This casserole also makes a wonderful New Year's Day meal!
